Subject: Safety Management Implementation Team: Roles and Responsibilities

The Safety Management Implementation Team chartered in April 1996 has completed more than one year of operations as the Department proceeds with the implementation and institutionalization of Integrated Safety Management Systems at sites throughout the complex. As we continue to progress our implementation program, I recognize that some infrastructure and organization realignments are required to address both existing and emerging challenges to the Department in this area. I have decided, after review of the Headquarters safety management initiative and framework, to put into effect a management infrastructure that will continue to serve the needs of the Department in this critical area, while acknowledging certain required personnel realignments. Within the current Departmental organization, as Director, Safety Management Implementation Team, I report to a Senior Policy Advisor to the Secretary of Energy on safety management implementation initiatives.

The Safety Management Implementation Team will continue to function as originally chartered and will provide day-to-day management guidance with respect to the Department's integrated safety management initiative. As part of its charter, the Team is responsible for tracking the implementation of integrated safety management throughout the complex. This includes reporting to the Department's management on the progress and status of the following:

- The addition of safety management-related DEAR clause requirements to appropriate site contracts;
- The completion and implementation of Functions, Responsibilities, and Authorities Manuals (FRAMs);
- The scheduling of Phase I and II safety management system verifications;
- Providing safety management courses of instruction and assistance visits as requested by site officials; and,
- Providing quarterly progress reports to senior Department management as to the progress in implementing integrated safety management throughout the complex and in achieving related goals in the Department's Strategic Plan.

As chartered, the Director, Safety Management Implementation Team, is also responsible for:

- Overseeing commitments and internal management actions outlined in the Implementation Plan for DNFSB Recommendation 95-2 and tracking accomplishment of actions using established line management channels;
- Providing consistent and clear program guidance for the implementation of integrated safety management and for ensuring coordination of other safety-related programs and initiatives with

this approach;

- Conducting quarterly public briefings to the DNFSB;
- Tracking and reconciling safety-related programs to assure consistency with the approach outlined in the 95-2 Implementation Plan;
- Conducting periodic meetings with the responsible lead officials for the Implementation Plan's commitments;
- Conducting periodic meetings with a "Core Team;"
- Advising senior Department managers of schedule variances and their impact on commitments and safety management system implementation, and recommending appropriate action;
- Chairing periodic Safety Management Workshops with Headquarters, Field, and contractor personnel to review Lessons Learned during the safety management systems implementation processes; and,
- Submitting 95-2 Implementation Plan correspondence to the Board reflecting completions and schedule enhancements for commitments and milestones in the Implementation Plan.

Specific actions expected of Safety Management Implementation Team members are as follows:

- Tracking and reporting on progress on specific safety management deliverables required of his or her organization;
- Participating in weekly (nominally) Safety Management Implementation Team conference calls/meetings and providing updates on their organization's progress in completing assigned tasks;
- Preparing materials for and participating in, as required, periodic and quarterly meetings with the DNFSB;
- Monitoring his or her organizational initiatives to ensure their consistency and coordination with the principles of safety management;
- Advising his or her senior managers of developing issues, schedule variances, and the like which potentially impact the Department's ability to meet its formal commitments in a timely manner; and,
- Attending periodic Safety Management Workshops with Headquarters, Field, and contractor personnel to review lessons learned from implementation efforts to date.
