CHAIRMAN CONWAY: Good morning,
everybody. Today's meeting and hearing was publicly
noticed in the Federal Register on January 12th,
2004, and is a meeting and hearing held open to the
public in accordance with provisions of the
Government in the Sunshine Act.

Originally, we were also going to have testimony this morning from the Department of Energy's Office of Environment, Safety and Health [ES&H], but that has been -- that witness has been postponed until Monday, February 9, 2004, and I notice where this change is being placed in the Federal Register today.

Today's meeting is an extension of the hearing held on September 10, October 21, 23, and December 3, 4, and 16, and constitutes the seventh in a series during which the Board is examining the Department of Energy's [DOE] current and proposed models of safety oversight in management of the contracts and contractors it relies upon to safely accomplish the mission assigned to DOE under the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

We will discuss -- we will focus on DOE's

proposed new initiatives and what impact, if any, 1 they may have upon assuring adequate protection of 2 health and safety of the public and workers at DOE's 3 defense nuclear facilities. 4 5 I welcome the witness this morning, Brigadier General Ronald J. Haeckel. He is the 6 7 Principal Assistant Deputy Administrator for Military 8 Application of the National Nuclear Security Administration [NNSA] within the Department of 9 10 Energy. 11 And with that, we turn to you, General, and, again, I welcome you here this morning. 12 13 GENERAL HAECKEL: Thank you, sir.
